

ORDINANCE NO. 2-99

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 1-83 ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE REGULATING TRAFFIC AND PARKING THROUGHOUT THE TOWNSHIP OF HAMILTONBAN; PROVIDING FOR THE ENFORCEMENT OF SAID ORDINANCE; AND SETTING FORTH PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF SAID ORDINANCE AND ALSO AMENDING ORDINANCE 10-96 ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING PARKING ON CERTAIN ROADS WITHIN HAMILTONBAN TOWNSHIP

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED, by the Supervisors of Hamiltonban Township, Adams County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same as follows:

Ordinance No. 1-83 entitled An Ordinance Regulating Traffic and Parking Throughout the Township of Hamiltonban; Providing for the Enforcement of said Ordinance; and Setting Forth Penalties for Violation of said Ordinance is hereby amended as follows:

Article 1 - Section 2. Temporary and Emergency Regulations, is amended by adding a new Subsection C.

C. The Board of Supervisors of Hamiltonban Township declare the following roads to be "snow emergency" roads and do hereby prohibit any parking along said roads hereinafter named after there is two inches of snow accumulation. The Township shall be authorized to install signs reading "snow emergency - no parking - after two inch accumulation" or something similar thereto. The roads affected are:

1. Lightning Trail

2. Rye Trail

3. Thunder Trail

4. Sour Mash Trail

5. Scotch Trail

6. Gin Trail

7. Dry Gin Trail

8. Sloe Gin Trail

9. Bourbon Trail

10. Rum Trail

11. On Carroll's Tract Road T-314 from the intersection of SR01001 at the Southwestern end of Orrtanna to the Northeastern end at the intersection of SR01001.

The fines for violating this Subsection of the Ordinance shall be as set forth in Subsection D. of Article 1 Section 2.

Ordinance No. 10-96 Entitled
An Ordinance Prohibiting Parking
On Certain Roads Within Hamiltonban
Township Is Amended as Follows:

Section 1. Parking of Vehicles shall be Prohibited on the Following Roads: Is amended to add a Subsection C. which reads:

C. Along the Western side of Beechwood Drive from Route 116 to Franklin Street.

These amendments are duly enacted and ordained by the Board of Supervisors of Hamiltonban Township, Adams County, Pennsylvania, this 6th day of July, 1999.
