

**HAMILTONBAN TOWNSHIP, ADAMS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA  
ORDINANCE NO. 04-03**

**AN ORDINANCE LIMITING PARKING WITHIN THE  
VILLAGE LIMITS OF ORRTANNA, ADAMS COUNTY,  
PENNSYLVANIA, AND ESTABLISHING PENALTIES FOR  
VIOLATION.**

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Township of Hamiltonban, Adams County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of same as follows:

Section 1: Parking in Orrtanna.

No motor vehicle as defined in the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code or wheeled vehicle or other mode of conveyance operating on wheels, with or without an engine or motor, shall be parked upon or along the west side of Carrolls Tract Road in the Village of Orrtanna, Adams County, Pennsylvania. This prohibition shall apply to both sides of Carrolls Tract Road (east and west) during snow conditions with an accumulation of two or more inches.

Section 2: Applicability.

The provisions of this Ordinance are applicable to both the owner of the vehicle or other mode of transportation and the person who last had possession of the item and left said wheeled vehicle or other wheeled mode of transportation in Carrolls Tract Road within the Village of Orrtanna.

Section 3: Violations and penalties.

Any person who shall violate any provision of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a summary offense and shall pay a fine of no more than \$1,000.00 for each offense and/or up to 30 days' imprisonment, together with costs and the Township's attorney's

fees. In addition, the Township shall have the authority to remove the property located on Carrolls Tract Road at the owner's expense by providing a written notice served upon said owner personally or by notice affixed to the item to be removed at least 72 hours before such removal. Such notice is not a precondition to a finding of a summary violation or imposition of the fines and penalties referred to above. The cost of removal, together with costs and attorney's fees, may be recovered in the summary prosecution or by separate civil proceeding. Each day that an offense continues after service of a summary citation upon the defendant under applicable rules of court shall be deemed a separate and distinct offense and punishable as such.

Section 4. Proof of ownership.

A record of a motor vehicle registration shall be prima facie evidence of ownership.

Section 5. Definitions.

As used in this Ordinance, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

**MODE OF CONVEYANCE OPERATING ON WHEELS** – Includes bicycles, carts, wagons, trailers and the like.

**OWNER** – A person or legal entity such as a partnership, a corporation, or other business or social entities.

Section 6. Additional remedies.

The Board of Supervisors of the Township may also enforce this Ordinance by civil enforcement action, including relief in equity seeking injunctive relief in addition to prosecution for a summary criminal offense.
